Are you finishing up your banners, scrapbooks, posters, drill shows, etc.?

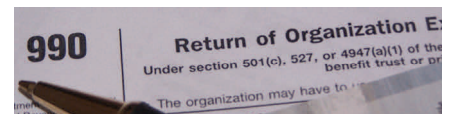
990 Time by Heather Pfister, PA Rainbow Secretary
